## **Marine Seminar**

**When:** Friday February 13, 2004; 2:00 PM – 3:30 PM

**Where:** Training Room, L.A. Fire Department Lifeguard Training Center  
2600 The Strand, Manhattan Beach (driving directions below)

**What:** The seminar will focus on marine services offered by the NWS, what forecasts we issue, how to access marine weather information, status of the buoy network, and NOAA weather radio. We will also discuss our new advanced digital marine forecasts (which will be available to view on the internet in the near future), and hope to hear from our marine customers what types of digital (graphical) forecast products would be most useful. Most importantly, we will seek input from seminar participants regarding what improvements the National Weather Service can make in its marine forecast and warning program.

**Who:** Anyone is welcome to attend the seminar. We hope to see you there!

### **Driving Directions:**

#### **From the northbound or southbound 405:**

Exit the freeway at the Rosecrans Ave. exit. Go west on Rosecrans Ave. for approximately 3 miles until the intersection with Bayview Dr. Turn left (south) on Bayview Dr. and proceed about a half mile south to 27<sup>th</sup> St. Turn right on 27<sup>th</sup> St. and proceed to the beachfront (Strand). There are two metered parking lots next to the Lifeguard Training Center. Park in the lot closest to the Training Center then go into the Training Center to obtain a parking permit. These permits should be placed in your car (on the dashboard) for the duration of the seminar, then returned to the Training Center at the end of the session.

NOTE: To get to the training room from the parking lot, go around the building to the right; then go down the stairs and turn left behind the building. The entrance to the training room will be on your left.
